Regulatory Update Distinguished Speakers October 18, 2018



Melissa McLawhorn Houston serves as Oklahoma Commissioner of Labor. She was appointed to office by Oklahoma Governor Mary Fallin on November 20th, 2015. Houston is an experienced administrator in state government and has considerable experience in state agency operational management, legislative process, and budgeting. As a survivor of the Oklahoma City Murrah bombing, she is a frequent speaker of the impact of terrorism. Previously, she served as Chief of Staff for the Oklahoma Attorney General and for the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security. Houston attended the University of Oklahoma where she earned a bachelor's degree in Letters and a Juris Doctor. She is active in the community serving on several boards including the Oklahoma City National Memorial and is a graduate of Leadership Oklahoma and Leadership Norman.



David Bates began his career with OSHA in the Little Rock, Arkansas office in 1983 as a student co-op. He worked as a compliance officer in the Dallas and Fort Worth offices from 1985 to 1993. He has worked for OSHA as an Assistant Area Director in Bridgeport, Connecticut and Little Rock, Arkansas Area Offices from 1993 until 2008, and is now the Area Director of the Oklahoma City, Oklahoma Area Office. David has a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Technology from the University of Central Arkansas.



Denese Deeds, CIH, is co-founder of Industrial Health & Safety Consultants, Inc (IH&SC) where she is the Director of Chemical Regulatory Services. In that function she prepares SDS, labels and other hazard communication documents and assists companies with overall chemical regulatory compliance. Prior to founding IH&SC she worked as an industrial hygienist for General Electric and Westinghouse. Denese is a certified Industrial Hygienist. Denese is active on the AIHA Stewardship and Sustainability Committee and served on the team that developed the SDS and Label Author Registry. She is an AIHA Fellow, a past president of the Society for Chemical Hazard Communication (SCHC), a Registered Specialist SDS and Label Authoring, the 2014 recipient of the AIHA Alice Hamilton Award and the Lifetime Achievement Award by SCHC in 2016.



John Dyer is the Director of the Pubic Employee Occupational Safety and Health Division, of the Oklahoma Department of Labor, where he manages the Public Sector Enforcement and Consultation Programs, Bureau of Labor Statistics Programs, and the Child Labor Division Programs. John has been with ODOL since 2012. John has worked for the State of Oklahoma for over 33 years, including other agencies such as: Oklahoma Department of Pollution Control, Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality, and Oklahoma Department of Transportation. He also serves in the Navy Reserve as his Command's top Senior Enlisted Leader. John holds dual Bachelor of Science degrees in Biology and Sociology from Oklahoma State University and a Master of Science in Industrial Hygiene from the University of Oklahoma, Health Sciences Center.



Lee Warden has been with the Air Quality Division of the ODEQ since 1996. She is the supervisor for the Engineering Unit in the Air Quality Division Permitting and Engineering Section. Her group focuses on permitting and air quality modeling.




